Unfortunately the state does not seem able - or willing - to resolve the impasse. The damage to pupils who are facing national exams in a few short months is something we should all be wary of. Whilst in schools like DHS we continue to be able to educate, there are some schools in the townships which have been closed for some time already, with no sign of teachers returning. The strikers have even targeted independent schools, and I heard on the weekend that Edgewood was under threat. When will the lunacy end?

In a week where little cocurricular activity was possible,



Everyone Counts

Lara Mellon, mother of Durban High School learner, James, has been instrumental in a worldwide campaign to raise funds for abandoned babies. The following is extracted from the web page www.everyonecounts.co.za:

everyONEcounts is an art initiative that aims to raise awareness and funds for charity.

In an article published in the Sunday Tribune regarding the increase in abandoned babies and the city's facilities to cope with this crisis; a leading politician reported was comment that relative to the total population of KwaZulu Natal, even a thousand unwanted babies was not significant and that other pressing issues were at hand.

Motivated and inspired to make a difference in the lives of the over 700 babies abandoned in South Africa each year, Lara Mellon, a Durban artist has initiated the everyONEcounts international campaign. Artists from around the world have been invited to respond with a creative voice, by pledging an original 30x30cm artwork which will each be sold for R1000, regardless of status or standing, and all proceeds will go towards places of safety for abandoned babies.

The response to date has been overwhelming; pledges from artists and sales to buyers from all over the world continue to stream in. Currently there are commitments from over 500 artists in Australia, Canada, Cypress, Denmark, Dubai, Taiwan, New Zealand, the US, UK, Zambia and from all over South Africa.

The goal is to achieve 1000 artworks so that R1 million can be raised for the care and protection of these abandoned lives.

The exhibition, which opens on 25 November, will be held at The Quays in Durban, which forms

part of the new Point Waterfront development and will run for three weeks.

All artworks can also be viewed and purchased online, through the everyONEcounts website. Visit www.everyonecounts.co.za for all details and a comprehensive artist's brief. Pledge a work, spread the word or buy an artwork and make sure that each life will know that they count.

The primary goal of the initial campaign is to showcase the humanitarian voice of artists across the globe and all monies will be used for the care and protection of abandoned lives.

everyONEcounts has been inundated with requests from school children to participate in this initiative, hence the birth of everyONEcounts@school.

everyONEcounts@school allows art educators and their learners to contribute to the everyONEcounts campaign by making artwork to raise funds for Shepherds Keep, a home for abandoned babies in Durban. More information can be found on the Projects page on the website.

Lara has donated a portion of the sales of her artwork to Shepherd's Keep since 1999. The babies who Shepherds Keep rescues are mostly newborns who have been "discarded" down latrines and pits, forsaken in deserted fields and increasingly and shockingly ... left in black bags on highways.

Art educators and their learners can contribute to the campaign by making artwork to raise funding for the campaign and importantly by creating awareness at school level.

Please note that some of the works of art will be exhibited at the DHS Moms' Com Breakfast on Friday 3 September in the AJ Human Room (Founders) from 07h15.
