From the Head Master's Desk

Well, we are finally at the end of the year! 2010 has been a busy and productive one for the school. The country has enjoyed the success of the World Cup and the nadir of the Education strike. As a school I can say that I really feel this has been a very good year for us. The school is on an upward curve, and the numbers for 2011 reflect this. We have over 230 Grade 8 boys next year, a number we have not had since the 1990's. Overall the school is increasing in size by about 100 boys. More importantly, the calibre of the intake is excellent. I would rather have a small school, but the laws of competition and economics say otherwise, so big it is! We also have only 3 staff leaving at the end of this year. Of these, Mr Ramathula is emigrating and Messrs Joseph and Bennett are at the end of their contracts. Compared with other schools this is remarkable. It is clear from these numbers that DHS is the school to be for boys and staff. I am delighted. I am looking to 2011 and beyond with great confidence.

I was delighted to attend the Speech Day at Prep last week. I am always proud of my Alma Mater, and this year was no different. Prep has had a very successful Centenary Year, and I am sure that all associated with this great school can look ahead with confidence. I was particularly pleased with the success of the boys who are enrolled at DHS for 2011. We are back to having an excellent intake from Prep. My thanks go to Mr Neave and his staff for their support. I hope we can continue to work well together for a very long time. Well done to the whole school on their excellent year.

As I write this now, the school is a quiet place. The boys are gone,

the SEM has been in to sign our schedules, and the timetable is complete for 2011. We have a few loose ends to tie up, and then we can look forward to a rest well earned. I am fortunate to be surrounded by thoroughly well organised staff. The planning and execution thereof is meticulous. We are ready for 2011 now. Not many schools can say that. We are indeed a fortunate few, and the aim of our department should be to bring as many schools as possible up to this kind of level. I remain positive that over time things will improve. As long as we all focus on doing the best for our children-and not on feathering our own nests!

Last week I went up to Howick with Mr Human to visit one of my old teachers, Mr Norman Lucas. Lucie turned 89 recently and had not been well. I was delighted to find him on top form, and full of the joys of life. He is a wonderful gentleman, full of stories and enthusiasm for life. For those who don't know him, he was the longest serving teacher at DHS before Mr Human toppled him from his crown. DHS was his first and only posting in education. Mr Human and I had a wonderful morning with Mr Lucas and his wife, and I look forward to returning.
