

On Thursday the 10 February the DHS Grade 9's were treated to a presentation by a group called Team Impact.

Team Impact's assembly programs former use professional, Olympic collegiate athletes performing an entertaining mixture of feats of strength, comedy and music communicate ageappropriate messages for hundreds thousands of students each year. Our boys were immediately captivated when 'Big' Sean was able to break a baseball bat over his knee and bend a metal rod with his bare hands!
