The Westville centre was almost able to run the length of the field before getting tackled, Westville were then able to hold onto the ball through two phases and score a try against the run of play. Westville were then able to extend their lead to 10-3 with a penalty shortly after the try. However, DHS did not give up and continued to do most of the attacking; school was rewarded with a penalty which Brendon Cope easily converted. The score was now 10-6 to Westville.


