### The De Ricquebourg's : 100 Years at DHS : 1911 - 2011

As told by Bully de Ricquebourg:

The first De Ricquebourg's to attend DHS were brothers Philippe (Bully's Grandfather) and Guy Ricquebourg who came to School in January 1911 (the 'de' had been removed from the front of the surname). Coming from the North Coast they were boarders. Their younger brother Paul followed in 1912.

In 1913 Phillippe was in the 5<sup>th</sup> form and represented the 1<sup>st</sup> XV. A S Langley was the Head Master. A C Martin, who was a junior master at the time, also played for the 1<sup>st</sup> XV.

In 1914 WW1 broke out. Having completed 5<sup>th</sup> form Phillippe decided to leave school and join the Natal Carabineers and went up to East Africa. At the end of the East African Campaign Philippe was hospitalized with Malaria. On recovery he was seconded to the NMR and went to France and fought with the SA forces at Delville Wood. We presume that Paul left in 1916. We do not have any information regarding Guy and Paul's achievements at school.

In 1946 Peter (Bully's father) and his elder brother, Mike, both came to School from St Charles. Mike was in 3<sup>rd</sup> form and Peter was in 2<sup>nd</sup> Form. Both were boarders as they were living on a farm at La Mercy the site of the new King Shaka Airport. Mike represented the 1<sup>st</sup> XV in 1948 and was also invited to the Natal schools Trials. Unfortunately, he was not chosen that year. In 1949 he again represented the 1<sup>st</sup> XV and was again invited to Natal schools trials. This time he was selected for the side. For his contribution he was awarded his honours Blazer for Rugby. Mike was also a school and Boarder Prefect, captained the shooting team where he received full colours and also attained half colours for Athletics. Mike also played rugby for DHSOB.

He then moved to Rhodesia and played for the county of Manicia Land. During the middle to late the All Blacks toured 50's Rhodesia and Mike was chosen to play against the mighty foe from the land of the long white cloud in the colours of Maniaca Land. He was also a very active member of the Rhodesian forces during their bush war. Peter played for the open "A" side and 2 games for the 2<sup>nd</sup> XV. They both left school in 1949.

(Bully's elder In 1969 Greg brother) came to school (by now the surname had been corrected to the correct spelling) and was one of the few boarders to live in both the new and the old Blackmore House. He matriculated in 1974 having played for the 1<sup>st</sup> XV, was awarded 1<sup>st</sup> team blazer (Half colours). Greg was Head Boy of Blackmore House and a school Prefect. He was awarded full colours for Athletics having won the 100m sprint. He went to the army like all fit lads of the time. Greg went to Angola and was involved in operation Savannah. He served the DLI for 30 years, 7 years as the 2<sup>nd</sup> In Command and 9 years as the Officer Commanding. He retired as a Lieutenant Colonel.

Bully arrived at DHS in 1971. The only good thing about him (he says) was that The Great Mr D C Thompson and he started at DHS on the same day. In 1972/73/74 Bully was chosen for the Natal Endurance water-ski racing team. At the end of 1975 he was chosen for the SA team to go and race in Milan. He declined as it would have affected his Matric year. He received half colours for athletics. Bully matriculated in 1976 was called up to the SAAF, spent 8 months on the boarder and retired after all his camps as a Major.

Steve (Bully's younger brother) was at DHS from 1974 to 1978 and was a boarder prefect. In his final

year he was captain of the 2<sup>nd</sup> XV but was then called up to the 1<sup>st</sup> XV. He was awarded 1<sup>st</sup> team Blazer (Half colours). On leaving school he played for the SA Agric Colleges, The Defence Force, Eastern TVL and South Eastern TVL. He completed his army obligation as a Full Lieutenant having been on the boarder for three months.

Justin (Bully's son) attended DHS from 2000 to 2005. He was a boarder prefect and a school prefect. He played a few games for the 2<sup>nd</sup> XV. He was awarded full colours for canoeing.

Greg's son Brett was at DHS from 2005 to 2009. He was a boarder and played  $2^{nd}$  team rugby.

Bully's 2<sup>nd</sup> son, Shaun, arrived at School in 2007 and matriculates in December 2011. He is also a boarder. He is Head Boy of Blackmore House and Deputy Head Boy of School. He represented the 1<sup>st</sup> XV and was awarded full colours for Academics and Half Colours for rugby.

In Summary, over a period spanning 100 years the De Ricquebourg's as a family have had:

- 53 Years association with the school
- 11 Boys at the school
- 5 1<sup>st</sup> XV players (one in every generation)
- 5 Blackmore House Prefects
- 5 Went to war
- 5 Full Colours awards
- 4 School Prefects
- 4 Generations
- 4 Half Colours Awards
- 2 Blackmore House Head Boys
- 1 Honour's Blazer
- 1 Natal School's Cap
- 1 Deputy Head Boy of School

Wow! What a history. We look forward to the next generation of De Ricquebourg's at School.
