This was a truly remarkable meeting for both, and Williams wanted to help out by making a donation to the initiative, due to its great significance on the lives of the young men who are involved.

With the support of Williams and many others, Simpson looks forward to continuing his initiative vear and next encourages the public to donate any old or new rugby boots and balls to Durban High School in the new year.
