Old Boy, Barry Richards, Visits DHS

The School welcomed back one of its greatest old boys this week at a special luncheon held in Founders. "The world's best-ever riahthanded opener", renowned cricketer Barry Richards, was welcomed back to the School by Mr Howard Buttery. Mr Buttery said that probably the greatest accolade for Barry was the fact that he was selected by Sir Donald Bradman (the greatest batsman of all time) in Bradman's all time ultimate Cricket XI team.

Barry Richards then thanked Mr Buttery and the School and reminisced about some wonderful stories of his times at School.

Barry presented the school with three photographs in a frame. One photo was taken before his first test cap in 1970; another was his DHS 1961 First XI photograph; and, the final photo was taken during his 325 not out innings in November 1971 - this was his most memorable achievement where, playing in Perth for South Australia, he blasted an unbeaten 325 in a single day.

Prominent Old Boys Howard Buttery, Arnold Zulman and Grayson Heath were also present at the luncheon, together with two first XI cricketers and a number of staff members.

Numerous stories from their School days were told with great humour and pride. interesting to hear how Grayson Heath was the Form Master of Form VR which included Barry Richards, Howard Buttery and Bruce Heath (Grayson's brother). Every Monday morning the class would wait to see what would transpire between Richards and the Form Master, who played cricket for KZN at the time. Barry Richards received "bacon slices" virtually every Monday because if he scored more runs for the School on the Saturday than the master did in the premier league, then he would be caned for showing off; and, if he scored fewer runs then he would be caned because a player of his talent should be scoring more runs than his Form Master.

The class would also wait expectantly each time Bruce Heath stood up to ask a question, quietly waiting to see if he called the master "Sir" or "Gray".

It was a privilege to entertain Old Boys of this calibre and a thoroughly enjoyable afternoon was spent with the staff members listening enthralled to the amusing tales of DHS in the early days.


Blues Band has been invited to perform at the annual Fender Blues Festival at Wilson's Wharf on 26 September.


